Dr James Naismith (1861-1939)

It's March Madness, which wouldn't be possible if not for basketball's inventor Dr Naismith. Born in Ontario, educated at McGill University he invented the game of basketball at a YMCA gymnasium in Springfield, MA. He developed the 13 original rules. He was a Presbyterian Minister, with degrees in Philosophy, Religion, Physical Education, and Medicine. Naismith was initiated in 1894 at Roswell Lodge, Springfield, MA, and was Worshipful Master in 1927, 1928 at Lawrence Lodge #6, Kansas.
