
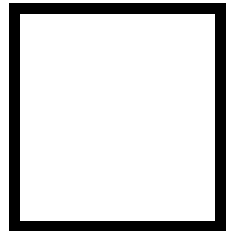

Mason of the Month

John Elway Jr.

Elway's success in football started in high school, where he compiled a record of 5711 passing yards with 49 touchdowns. He was the starting quarterback at Stanford as a sophomore. First drafted by the Baltimore Colts, he was traded to the Denver Broncos, where he played for 16 seasons. He brought the Broncos to 5 Super Bowls with 2 championships. He was the second player in the NFL to throw over 50,000 yards. Elway was the MVP in 1987, AFC's Offensive player in 1993, and Super Bowl's XXXIII's MVP. He retired in 1999 and serves as General Manager of the Broncos. He is the founder of the John Elway Foundation helping abused children. Elway is a member of South Denver Masonic Lodge #93.
