Mason of the Month

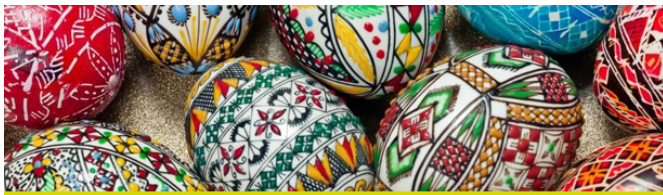

William Claude Dukenfield (a.k.a. W. C. Fields) 1880-1946

Fields was a comedy actor and entertainer and used Fields as his stage name starting in 1898. His early act was juggling, and he would intentionally drop balls and then blame the balls. This got lots of laughs.

In 1915 he was a regular with the Ziegfeld Follies. In the 1920's he left Broadway to work in movies until the 1940's, when his drinking issues made studios reluctant to work with him. Fields was a member of E. Coppee Mitchell Lodge #605 in Philadelphia, PA. He was suspended for non payment of dues in 1924.

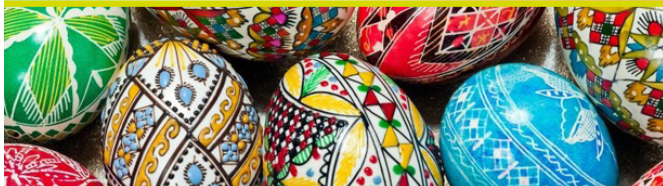

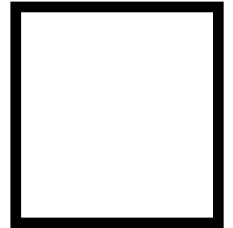
