Fred B. Balzar

Fredrick Bennet Balzar was raised on August 28th 1908 in Inyo Lodge #221. Later he affiliated with Carson Lodge #1 in Carson City NV.

Balzar served as the 15th Governor of Nevada from 1926 until his passing in 1934 from illness. His friend and Brother, Will Rodgers, said Balzar was a "real two-fisted governor." (LA Times 3/23/1934)
