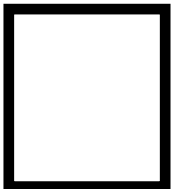

## Mason of the Month

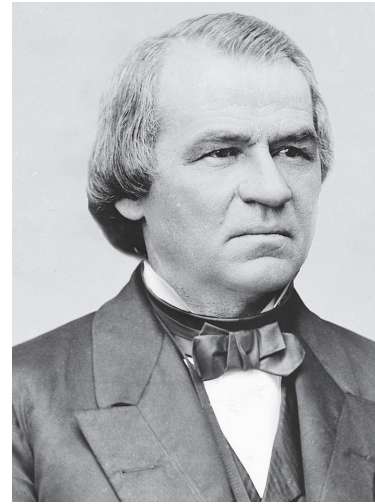

Andrew Johnson (1808-1875)

Johnson was our 17<sup>th</sup> President (1865-1869), assuming the office after the assassination of President Lincoln. Tailor by trade, he served as mayor, state legislator, U.S. House of Representatives, Governor of Tennessee, and U.S. Senator. He was “groomed” by his wife, Eliza McCardle, and made wise investments in Greeneville, Tennessee. Although a racist, he disagreed with the breakup of the Union.

This made him a traitor in the South and a hero in the North. Lincoln felt he needed Johnson to balance his ticket. After becoming President, Johnson blocked many efforts in reconstruction, which led to his impeachment. By one vote, the Senate failed to convict him. He is viewed as one of our worst presidents. He was raised to Master Mason in Greeneville Lodge #119, Greeneville, Tennessee.

He was also a member of York Rite and Scottish Rite.
